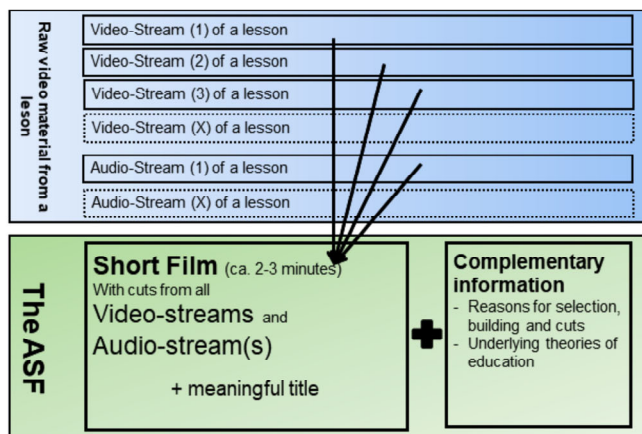


# The Analytical Short Film (ASF)

## What is an Analytical Short Film?

For us, the ASF is the articulation of a point of view on classroom praxis using a short film with about 2 – 3 minutes length which is supported by a supplementary text.

In detail: For the creation of an ASF, you need raw video material from a lesson. Ideally, this material consists of several video streams, each showing the classroom praxis from another perspective. If there is group work or similar in the lesson, it will also be useful to have several audio streams.

The short film consists of several cuts from these video and audio streams. The film must have a meaningful title which summarizes its main viewpoint. The short film must be supplemented by an additional text, the so called „Complementary Information“, which most usefully is in tabular form. The Complementary information gives reasons for the selection of each and every cut in the short film. It also explains the overall structure of the film. Depending on the scenario you are using the short film in, it is also necessary to explicitly state the theories of education the short film is referring upon. Together, the Short Film and the Complementary Information form the Analytical Short film.
